What does the service do?

Home Safety Service will assess an individual's needs and outline technology which can maximise their independence while supporting their health and wellbeing outcomes in their own home or a community setting.

When an alert is raised, operators in West Lothian Council Careline can access emergency help if required or contact a keyholder or family member for assistance.

Sensors can include items that send alerts if they press a button for help, fall or don't move for a long period or alert if smoke, heat or carbon monoxide is detected.

Sensors can also be used as part of a Health & Social Care assessment to help determine what other supports maybe required as part of their care planning.

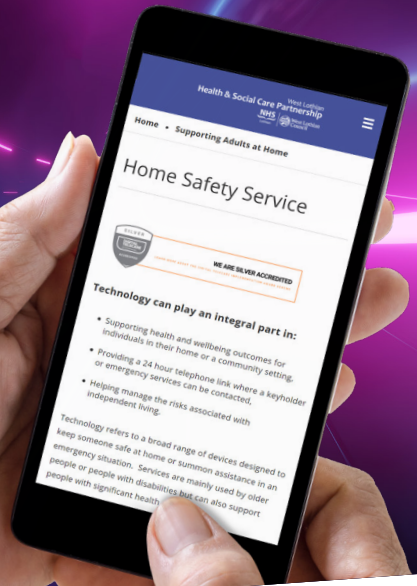
The aims:
