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

1. Do you need help to read this document?

If you cannot read or speak English, the council can provide this information in a variety of ways:

2. Our Service Aims

Burnside is located within two adjacent houses in Uphall. It provides short breaks (respite) for up to six individuals at any one time. The service provides respite support to carers as well as the chance for individuals to gain experience of living away from the family environment and learning a range of independence skills.

3. Who is the service for?

The service is for anyone living in West Lothian, aged from 16 and over who has a learning disability and needs regular respite breaks.

4. How do I apply?

If you want to find out more, you can apply by contacting the Adult Assessment Team and asking for an assessment.

5. What does the service do?

Burnside offers:

- Staff cover at nights
- 6 private bedrooms
- evening and weekend social activities
- chance to make new friends
- fully accessible facilities
- Stays can be from 1 14 nights.

Your own suggestions for activities are most welcome.

6. How does it work?

Burnside is open all year round. The staff team consists of one assistant manager and a team of residential workers. Extra staff are drafted in as needed. Staff work on a shift rota and provide overnight cover. The house is not usually staffed during the day when people are out and about but this can be negotiated.

7. Our Care Standards

The delivery of all services within Burnside will be carried out within the stated aims of the West Lothian Learning Disability Service Statement, Partnership In Practice Report and National Care Standards. These include the following key themes;

- Enabling and sustaining independence
- Improving quality of life and promoting choice
- Promoting inclusion / service user involvement
- Meeting lifelong learning needs

- Meeting healthcare needs
